# The Year of the Holy Spirit: "He will guide you into all the truth"

THIS YEAR HAS BEEN DESIGNATED by Pope John Paul II as a time for Catholics to continue preparation for the millennium by reflecting upon "the Holy Spirit and his sanctifying presence within the community of Christ's disciples."

Following the Holy Father's emphasis, Women for Faith and Family has titled its fourteenth annual conference *The Year of the Holy Spirit: He will guide you into all the truth.* 

The conference will be held October 9-11, at the St. Louis Marriott Pavilion Downtown.

The Catechism states that "to be in touch with Christ we must first have been touched by the Holy Spirit" who "unveils Christ to us". But how do we discern the Holy Spirit in this deconstructionist age, with so many new, conflicting, aggressive claims to truth?

This question and others will be addressed by speakers at the 1998 WFF Conference.

#### Featured speakers

St. Louis **Archbishop Justin F. Rigali** will present the keynote address at the opening session on Friday evening, immediately following a celebration of Vespers.

A native of Los Angeles, Archbishop Rigali served in the diplomatic service at the Vatican for many years. Ordained archbishop by Pope John Paul II in 1985, he was head of the English-speaking section of the Vatican Secretariat of State, and served as secretary of the Congregation for Bishops and the College of Cardinals before coming to St. Louis in 1994.

**Elizabeth Fox-Genovese**, a teacher of history, literature and women's studies at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, and a recent convert to Catholicism, will speak at the Saturday evening banquet. An account of her conversion appeared in *Crisis* in November 1997.







Father John O'Leary of Tottenham, England will be principal celebrant and homilist at the 8 am Mass on Saturday. Bishop Joseph Naumann, auxiliary bishop of St. Louis, will be the principal celebrant and homilist at a pontifical Mass on Sunday at noon. Music at the Sunday Mass will be provided by the choir of Rosati-Kain High School, under the direction of Christine Patton.
